Purpose of the Position:

Working in a small Engagement team, the Policy and Research Officer plays an important role to positively build and enhance the reputation of the Council with key stakeholders and customers.

The primary purpose of this role is to coordinate and support the Council's engagement in the political, government and regulatory spheres, specifically related to our physiotherapy education accreditation and assessment functions.

Key Deliverables:

The role is a combination of operational and strategic, undertaking research and critical analysis for the Council across the policy, political and healthcare landscapes.

Key responsibilities include:

- Able to rapidly appraise large volumes of information and derive critical issues for the physiotherapy workforce
- Coordinate activities and reporting related to government reviews, recommendations, and policy directives
- Analyse and work with the executive team to draft responses to government reviews
- Provide advice and briefings to Council's leadership on matters related to engagement with Commonwealth, state and territory governments and other external regulatory bodies
- Monitor external sources of information to ensure the Council remains aware of activities, healthcare reviews and policy influences that may impact the Council's work in healthcare regulation and the broader healthcare environment.
- Produce policy updates for internal stakeholders
